



What to do if the inverter battery is swallowed

What should I do if I swallowed a disk battery?

The most prudent home treatment for someone who has swallowed a disk battery is to give nothing by mouth and to go to the nearest hospital emergency department. If it will not delay going to the emergency department, bring a sample of the battery ingested.

What should I do if my child swallowed a button battery?

If you suspect your child has swallowed a button battery, you should take them to your nearest Accident and Emergency (A&E) department as quickly as possible. Do not give them anything to eat or drink or try to make them sick as this could cause damage as the battery is vomited back up as well as the damage it caused when swallowed.

What should I do if a button battery is ingested?

Call the National Button Battery Ingestion Hotline, (800) 498-8666, to be consulted for battery identification and emergency instructions. If instructed, take the person to the nearest Emergency Department for medical care. If you cannot find the battery that was ingested from the device, bring it to the Emergency Department.

What should I do if I eat a battery?

Call the National Battery Ingestion Hotline at 800-498-8666 (collect, if necessary) or Poison Control at 1-800-222-1222, or go to your local emergency department. If possible, bring the battery package or a matching battery. In most cases, you will be advised to get an X-ray immediately. 2. Keep the Person Safe Do not induce vomiting.

What happens if you swallow a button battery?

Older children and adults may also ingest batteries as a means of self-harming. The swallowing of button batteries needs to be treated as a medical emergency. Removal of the battery alone may be insufficient action to prevent further damage as symptoms can manifest up to 28 days later.

What happens if you swallow a disk battery?

The person who has swallowed a disk battery may have one or more symptoms. Although mercury-containing cells tend to fragment, no clinical cases of mercury poisoning have been reported. Signs of mercury poisoning are lethargy, excitement, rash in the perineal/diaper region, or tremors. What Procedures and Tests Diagnose Battery Ingestion?
